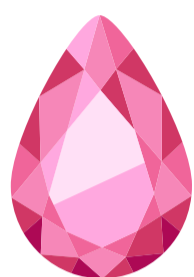

Rarity Grade: **Very Rare**

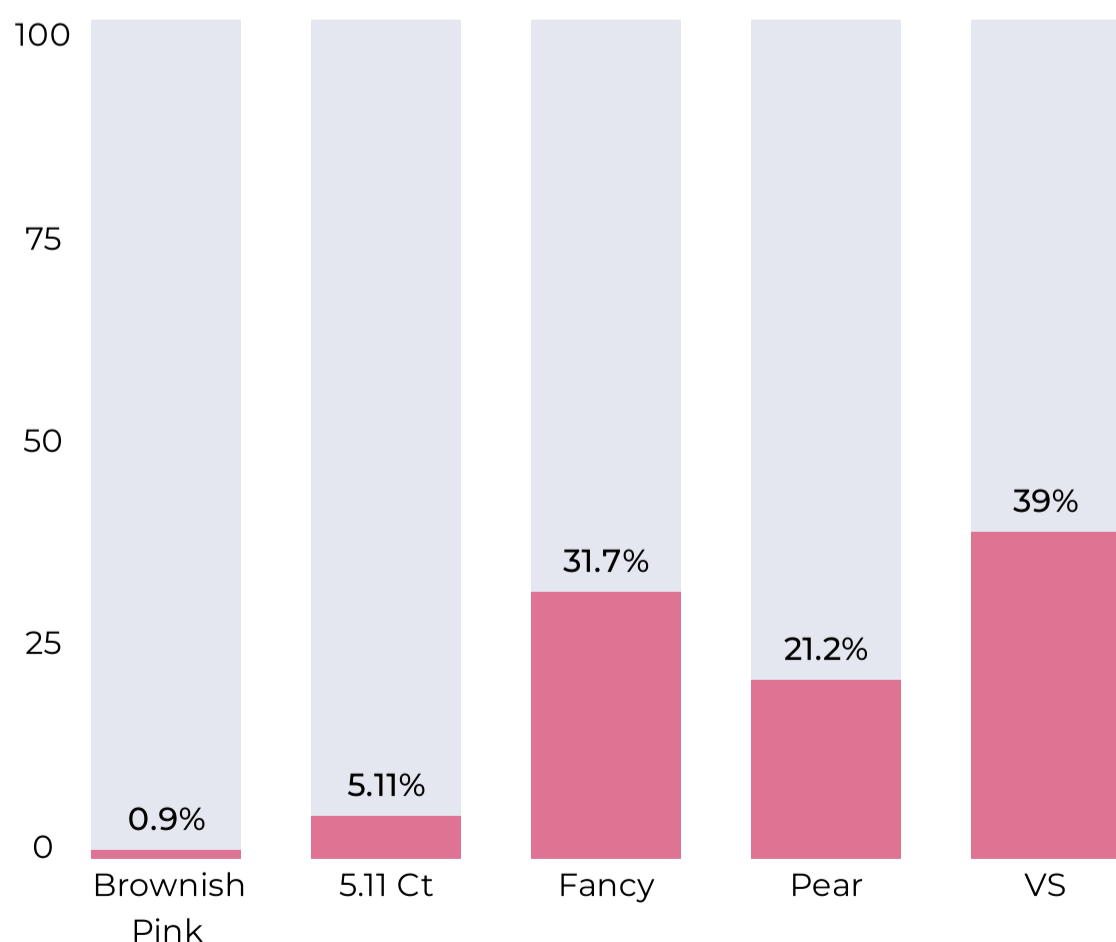
A similar diamond enters the market **once every 3 to 4** years.

When light hits a polished diamond, some of the light waves are absorbed by defects in the diamond's atomic structure. The color sensation of diamonds from the pink or brown family is created when light passes through a deformed atomic structure, absorbing the green and blue light.
